3 THINGS YOU CAN DO TO HELP

1.BUY a REUSABLE water BOTTLE

Instead of buying mineral water in those disposable bottles, go for a REUSABLE BOTTLE instead. You can buy one at the Church's gift shop. Feel free to fill it up (for free!) at the Church's water stations.



Help us regenerate Cambodian hardwood forests. Donate to our tree-planting fund. Every US dollar that you give will support the purchase and planting of 1 Cambodian hardwood tree seedling. We promise to plant this for you in the Preah Vihear Province where the Church is establishing an ecology center, with our own plot of protected forest. (For every flight we take, Jesuits in Cambodia donate 5\$ to this carbon-offset fund. You may want to do the same.)



3.PRAY in the GARDEN OF LAUDATO SI

Spend some time around our gardens and marvel at the beauty of nature. Visit the statue of St. Francis of Assisi meditating Cambodian style in the area we've called the Garden of *Laudato Si*. Ask St. Francis to bless and teach us to care more for all of God's creation.
